

Search for past newspapers

Maisaku stores almost all the pages of the Mainichi Shimbun from its inauguration edition to 1999.In particular, all issues of its Tokyo head office edition are stored without a single missing issue, serving as important historical materials. When the Mainichi Shimbun was inaugurated in 1872, the lunar calendar was still widely used, and both the dates on the solar and lunar calendars were written on the Mainichi Shimbun at the time.





Mainichi Shimbun article search

The final morning and evening editions of the Mainichi Shimbun published by its Tokyo, Osaka, Seibu and Chubu head offices and Hokkaido branch as well as articles carried on local news pages of all prefectures are stored on the system. You can search for storage by keywords, dates, type of pages and page numbers. You can also search for the headlines of main articles published in 1986 and before using keywords.

- Frequency of renewing articles: daily (registered immediately after publishing)
- Period of storage and contents:

- *1987 \sim : Texts of articles

Mainichi public opinion search

Whole new database on opinion polls

You can search for the results of opinion polls that the Mainichi Shimbun has conducted since the end of World War II by entering keywords and dates. You can view the pages that carry the opinion polls you search for. The database carries records by gender and age that are not carried in the paper as well as graphs showing the approval ratings of Cabinets and political parties in the post-war period. You can effectively use materials in the database as basic data for political science and statistics. We regularly update the data.



- Period of storage: October 1945 ~
- Contents:1.The results of about 400 opinion polls covering eligible voters across the country (Questions, answers and survey methods. Records by gender and age since 1966 are carried.) 2. Graphs showing the approval ratings of Cabinets and political parties, and so on.

Weekly Economist

The Economist site carries articles and pages (PDF) of the weekly business magazine the Weekly Economist. You can search for articles by entering their keywords, the names of their writers and news fields. This site is popular with libraries at universities that have an economic faculty as well as with businesses.

2,001 major incidents in the 20th century

This site carries news articles, photos and pages briefly reporting 2,001 major incidents that occurred in the 20th century. You can search for them by entering the years, fields, dates and keywords. It is convenient for those who are not good at chronologically searching for articles.
